The charitable organization joins the Bucks County Audubon Society to celebrate Earth Day 2018

NEW HOPE, PA—APRIL 11, 2018—[GreenDrop](#), the organization revolutionizing how consumers support charities and recycle responsibly through the donation of gently used clothing and household goods, announces its partnership with [Bucks County Audubon Society](#) for its third annual [Earth Day Festival](#) being held on **Saturday, April 14**.

The Earth Day Festival will take place from **11 a.m. to 4 p.m.** at **2877 Creamery Road in New Hope, PA** and features fun Earth Day-inspired activities including live wildlife presentations, bird walks, and bug hunts alongside food and fun from environmentally friendly vendors. GreenDrop will have a truck on-site to accept donations to benefit charities including the [National Federation of the Blind](#), the [Military Order of the Purple Heart](#), the [Society of St. Vincent de Paul of Philadelphia](#), and the [American Red Cross](#).

In addition to Bucks County Audubon Society, GreenDrop has partnered with nine additional organizations and schools located throughout the Mid-Atlantic region, where the organization has 28 unique [drop-off locations](#), in support of Earth Day 2018.

“We’re excited to join the Bucks County Audubon Society for a fun day of promoting environmental stability, and provide residents an opportunity to recycle their unwanted goods and reduce waste while giving back to charity,” says GreenDrop CEO Tony Peressini.

By recycling former gasoline stations, GreenDrop offers consumers clean, brightly lit, and safe drive-up locations where they are greeted at their car by uniformed GreenDrop attendants, who unload donations, provide tax-deductible receipts and allow consumers to direct their giving to the American Red Cross, the Saint Vincent de Paul Society of Philadelphia, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, or the National Federation of the Blind. In 2017, these charities received \$2.5 million through donations to GreenDrop facilities, which are sorted and then resold at area thrift stores, sent overseas or recycled for their fibers and parts.
